Modal Verbs

CAN

“**CAN**” is one of the most commonly used modal verbs in English. “**CAN**” is used with different meanings as a **modal verb**.



ABILITY	I can speak three languages.
REQUEST	Can you hand me the pencil?
OFFER	I can send this letter for you.
PERMISSION	Can I borrow your notebook?
POSSIBILITY	It can get very hot there these days.

SHOULD

▶ 1) Should

▶ *should* is used to give advice ,to make recommendations or to talk about what we think is right or wrong.

▶ *positive form : should*

EX : You should eat more slowly.

▶ *negative form : shouldn't*

EX : You shouldn't work so much.

MUST

- ▶ 2) must
- ▶ *must is used to talk about an obligation or duties.*
- ▶ *positive form : must*

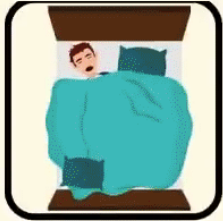
EX : You must do your homework .

- ▶ *mustn't is used to forbid something ,it is forbidden.*

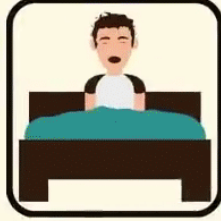
EX : You mustn't be late .
