Language in context

Artificial Intelligence (AI): AI is like a smart robot that can learn and make decisions on its own.

Computer-Generated Speech: It's when a computer talks or reads out loud.

Computer Translation: It's when a computer changes words from one language to another.

Virtual Assistant: A helper program on a device that can answer questions and do tasks for you.

Image Recognition: It's when a computer can recognize and understand pictures.

Text to Speech (TTS): It's a tool that reads out text as spoken words.

Speech to Text: It's when spoken words are turned into written text by a computer.

Operating System (OS): It's the main program that runs your computer and lets you use other programs.

Voice Activation: It's a way to start something using your voice.

Voice Recognition: It's when a computer can identify who is speaking.

Beta Version: An early version of a program given to people to try and give feedback.

Working Prototype: A basic model of something to show how it can work.

Chatbot: A computer program you can talk to in a chat.

perfect tenses are used to talk about actions that are already completed

Grammar

What tense are these sentences?

I am reading a book.

I was reading a book last night.

How do you know?

the continuous tenses are used to talk about an action that happens over a period of time

Grammar

Both continuous and perfect tenses have future form as well

Future perfect

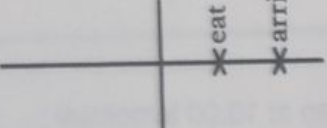
We use it to talk about the actions that will be completed before a given time in the future

Will + Have + Past participle

Ex:

I will have finished my project next week.

By the time you arrive, she will have cooked the dinner.

Grammar

Both continuous and perfect tenses have future form as well

Future continuous

We use it to talk about the actions that will be in progress at a given time in the future

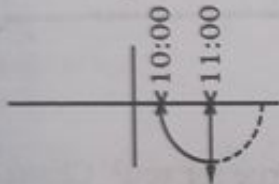
Will + be + verb + ing

Ex:

I will be exercising at the gym at 8:00.

Tomorrow at noon, he will be giving a presentation at the conference.

Future Progressive



(c) Tom ***will be sleeping*** when we arrive.

Tom will go to sleep at 10:00 tomorrow night. We will arrive at 11:00. The action of sleeping will begin before we arrive, and it ***will be in progress at a particular time in the future***. Probably his sleep will continue.
